**1. Resolutions and Presentations**

- (1). Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 89, Adaptations for Special Populations, Subchapter D, Special Education Services and Settings  
(First Reading and Filing Authorization)

The board approved technical edits to the rules for special education instructional arrangements and settings, and clarified changes to state and federal regulations.

The board approved the repeal of the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for high school Career and Technical Education and career development courses that were effective in 1998, to incorporate new rules that are effective with the 2010-2011 school year.

3. **Consideration of Petition for Adoption of Rule Change Concerning 19 TAC Chapter 74, Curriculum Requirements, Subchapter F, Graduation Requirements, Beginning with School Year 2007-2008**

The board voted to allow students who successfully complete a two or three-credit career and technical education work-based training course prior to the 2011-2012 school year to count the class towards physical education graduation requirements. Recent updates to the graduation requirements had eliminated these CTE classes as options for P.E. substitution credit beginning in the 2010-2011 school year, which caused difficulty for some upcoming seniors who planned to satisfy the P.E. requirement with a CTE substitution for their senior year.

**4. Proclamation 2012 of the State Board of Education Advertising for Bids on Instructional Materials**

The state's looming budget deficit, estimated to be \$18 billion in the next biennium, caused the board to indefinitely postpone issuing textbook Proclamation 2012, which would call for the purchase of new kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade science instructional materials. The kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade science materials were estimated to cost \$347 million, which would be in addition to the \$888 million in funding that must be requested to cover already approved new English language arts materials, continuing contracts and freight. Instead, board members decided to purchase supplemental instructional materials that only cover new science curriculum standards for science classes offered in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8, as well as biology, chemistry, physics and Integrated Physics and Chemistry. The board agreed to allow publishers to submit bids on a per-student, per-teacher or statewide license basis.

**5. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 113, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Social Studies, Subchapter A, Elementary, Subchapter B, Middle School, and Subchapter C, High School, and 19 TAC Chapter 118, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Economics with Emphasis on the Free Enterprise System and Its Benefits, Subchapter A, High School (Second Reading and Final Adoption)**

After extensive debate and consideration of hundreds of amendments, the board approved revised social studies curriculum standards on a series of 9-5 votes for kindergarten through eighth grade and high school. Updated TEKS for economics were approved on a 14-0 vote. The final version of the standards will eventually be posted at <http://www.tea.state.tx.us/index2.aspx?id=3643> but, because of the extensive revisions, it is expected to be weeks before the final standards are updated and verified.

## COMMITTEE ON INSTRUCTION

**6. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 112, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Science, Subchapter D, Other Science Courses (Second Reading and Final Adoption)**

The board approved revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 112, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Science, Subchapter D, Other Science Courses. The revisions add designated Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses to the list of courses that may satisfy high school science credit requirements and also include minor modifications to the Principles of Technology course that may satisfy the physics graduation requirement to align with end-of-course assessment requirements. The following courses can satisfy the fourth science credit required for the Recommended High School Program and the Distinguished Achievement Program: Advanced Animal Science, Advanced Biotechnology, Advanced Plant and Soil Science, Food Science, and Forensic Science.

**7. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 111, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics, Subchapter D, Other High School Mathematics Courses (Second Reading and Final Adoption)**

The board approved revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 111, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics, Subchapter D, Other High School Mathematics Courses. The revisions add designated Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses to the list of courses that may satisfy high school mathematics credit requirements. The approval allows Mathematical Applications in Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources; Engineering Mathematics; and Statistics and Risk Management to count for the third mathematics credit under the Minimum High School Program. In addition, Mathematical Applications in Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources may count as one of the four math credits under the Recommended High School Program if taken prior to Algebra II. Engineering Mathematics and Statistics and Risk Management were added as courses that may satisfy the fourth mathematics credit requirement under the Recommended High School Program and the Distinguished Achievement Program

**8. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 89, Adaptations for Special Populations, Subchapter B, Adult Basic and Secondary Education (Second Reading and Final Adoption)**

The board approved revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 89, Adaptations for Special Populations, Subchapter B, Adult Basic and Secondary Education. The proposed revisions reflect changes resulting from the General Appropriations Act, Senate Bill (SB) 1, Article III, Rider 46, 81st Texas Legislature, 2009. The revisions ensure that adult education providers are in compliance with new procedural and reporting requirements.

**9. Proposed Revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 74, Curriculum Requirements, Subchapter C, Other Provisions (First Reading and Filing Authorization)**

The board approved for first reading and filing authorization proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 74, Curriculum Requirements, Subchapter C, Other Provisions. The proposed revisions update various sections within the subchapter as a result of the statutorily required four-year review of rules.

The board approved a list of innovative courses for a three-year period that includes: PeaceKeepers: School Team Mediation; Peers Accepting Learning and Sharing I & II; StrengthBank® for High Schools: A Relationship Skills Initiative I-IV; and Script Your Life for Leadership. Innovative courses are courses that do not fall within any of the subject areas of the foundation or enrichment curriculum.

## **12. Approval for Substitution of Instructional Materials**

The board approved a publisher's request to substitute a newer version of its currently adopted elementary mathematics textbook. The Math Learning Center was granted permission to substitute its currently adopted Mathematics, Grade 5, Elementary School product entitled Texas Bridges in Mathematics, with a new version, Bridges in Mathematics, Grade 5.

## **COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL FINANCE/PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND**

### **13. Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 33, Statement of Investment Objectives, Policies, and Guidelines of the Texas Permanent School Fund, §33.65, Guarantee Program for School District Bonds (Second Reading and Final Adoption)**

The board approved amendments modifying the policies for administration of the Bond Guarantee Program to comply with requirements related to the recent decision of the Internal Revenue Service to reopen the program and to align with the policies of the intercept program to provide credit enhancement for school district bonds. The amendment also modifies the existing limitations on access to the guarantee and adds explanations of the actions that would follow a default by a school district. Under the amendments, the board increased the multiplier from 2.5 percent to 3 percent to allow for more bond capacity. This 0.5 percent increase will allow for an estimated two years worth of capacity in the program. Board members also approved retaining the \$2,300 application fee.

### **14 Adoption of Review of 19 TAC Chapter 109, Budgeting, Accounting, and Auditing (Moved to the Consent Agenda)**

The board adopted the review of its rules in 19 TAC Chapter 109, Budgeting, Accounting, and Auditing, Subchapters A-D. The rules provide requirements for school districts relating to: budgeting, accounting, financial reporting, and auditing; Texas Education Agency (TEA) audit functions; adoption by reference of the Financial Accountability System Resource Guide; and the uniform bank bid and depository contract.

**18. Review of Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 245, Certification of Educators from Other Countries (Moved to the Consent Agenda)**

The board took no action on a review of the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) rules that amend 19 TAC Chapter 245, Certification of Educators from Other Countries. This will update the rules to reflect current law and add specificity to the requirements relating to the issuance of a Texas educator certificate based on certification from another country.
